

White Wines

1. **Franschoek Cellar Chenin Blanc, Franschoek, South Africa** £14.25
Brilliant value wine from Chenin, the Cape's favourite white grape. Full, ripe apple fruit mingles with tropical flavours leading to a clean, dry finish. As ideal with food as it is without.

2. **Amanti del Vino, Pinot Grigio, Delle Venezie IGT, Italy** £15.25
Pinot Grigio from northern Italy is the dry white wine of the moment! This one, from near Venice, is crisp, refreshing and unoaked, making it perfect for drinking before or during any meal.

3. **La Cabane Blanc, VdP du Comté Tolosan 2009** £14.25
A fresh and aromatic white with juicy fruit made from soft-pressed Colombard and Ugni Blanc grapes grown in the rolling Gascon countryside. It is crisp but easy-going, suitable for all occasions and represents the best of modern French wine.

4. **Rémi & Jérôme Dry Muscat, VdP d'Oc 2009** £16.95
It is floral and grapey on the nose with some delicious peppery hints and a lick of freshness on the finish.

5. **C J Pask Sauvignon Blanc, Hawke's Bay 2009** £19.95
A typical New Zealand Sauvignon with opulent, ripe, tropical fruit and all the classic Sauvignon character one could wish for. This is from a winery on the outskirts of Hastings run by dynamic duo, Chris Pask and Kate Radburn.

6. **Mâcon-Vergisson, La Roche, Nadine et Maurice Guerrin 2008** £22.50
From one parcel of vines on top of the spectacular Vergisson escarpment comes this delightfully mineral, 'bready', Chablis-style Mâcon. It's a great fish or shellfish wine which can also develop for a couple of years in bottle.

7. **Chablis, Pascal Bouchard 2008** £23.95
A classic Chablis with freshness, minerality and good weight from an excellent producer. Pascal and Romain Bouchard make fresh, characterful wines in a modern winery from grapes both from their own domaine and bought in.

Red Wines

8. **Orquestra Tempranillo, VdT Castilla La Mancha, Spain 2008** £15.50
Fresh and berry-scented with a hint of toasty oak behind, developing a round, smooth textured feel in the mouth and easy on the finish. The warmth of the Spanish plains comes through here, in an honest, good value red wine.

9. **Pato Torrente Merlot Central Valley, Chile 2009** £16.50
Bursting with cherry and ripe, red berry fruits intertwined with pepper and a touch of coffee bean. Elegant and medium bodied, this is an easy, pleasing all-rounder, delicious with pasta, ham and cheese.

10. **Amanti del Vino, Nero d'Avola/Syrah, Sicilia IGT, Italy** £16.25
A deeply coloured, juicy red with crunchy black cherry fruit. It's a Sicilian blend of Nero d'Avola, the island's top grape for reds, and Syrah (aka Shiraz), which some locals claim to have originated in Syracuse on Sicily!

11. **Lyrebird Shiraz/Cabernet, Victoria, Australia** £16.95
From the family-run Wingara Winery in Mildura comes this ripe and fruity red that overflows with berries, plums and a dollop of vanilla oak. Well-balanced, soft and juicy, and a wine that boxes above its weight.

12. **Côtes du Rhône, Les Grandes Serres 2008** £17.50
This is a good, simple Côtes du Rhône: it has typical peppery flavours and light, fresh fruit that goes well with red meat and game.

13. **Arjona, Rioja, Spain 2008** £17.50
Antonio Navajas is a producer with a fine reputation and is based in the Rioja Alta. This has lovely cherry fruit flavours and a hint of vanilla. With a little Crianza wine added, it has an extra dimension.

14. **Côte de Brouilly, Les Volcaniques, J Charlet 2009** £20.50
From the slopes of the distinctive, round hill of Brouilly comes this fruity Beaujolais. Its aromas of violets, then red fruits and little tannin make for a good glass of wine. Loron & Fils is a well-respected, family house.

15. **Tierra de Luna Malbec, Mendoza, Bodega Lurton 2009** £19.95
A medium-bodied, supple wine with soft tannins. Typically generous, concentrated black berry fruit, fat and spicy with a long lingering finish. Brilliant for roasts and barbecues!

16. **Massaya Classic, Bekaa Valley, Lebanon 2007** £20.50
Spicy notes with ripe, meaty, blackberry and red fruits, and a touch of chocolate. This supple, round wine is from an exciting French-Lebanese collaboration, which owns vineyards at an altitude of 1,000 metres in the Bekaa Valley.

17. **Trentham Estate Pinot Noir, New South Wales, Australia 2009** £21.95
Winemaker Anthony Murphy owns and runs this family estate on the Victoria border at Mildura. He is a big fan of Pinot as demonstrated by this well-structured number, full of red berry fruit, toasty oak and a soft, lingering finish.

18. **Château Montaguillon, Montagne-Saint-Emilion 2006** £28.50
This has a delicious supple red fruit character of plums, blackcurrants and cherries backed up by good structure and ripe tannins. It will age well. The property is wonderfully situated looking down to Saint-Emilion and Pomerol.

Rosé Wines

19. **Pinot Grigio Rosé, Provincia di Pavia IGT, Ca'Solare, Italy** £15.95
A copper pink rosé from Northern Italy's Pavia region with gently fragrant summer fruits on the nose and delicate strawberry fruit on the palate. Fruitily off-dry.

20. **Tanners French Rosé, VdP des Côtes de Gascogne** £17.50
Sourced from the Béraut family at Domaine de Pellehaut in the Gers, this juicy, racy rosé has been a fantastic success since release. Vibrant summer fruits nose and a soft strawberry flavour mean one bottle isn't enough!

Diggers Rest

Champagne & Sparkling Wine

21. **Prosecco, Vetriciano, Italy** £18.95
An attractive biscuity nose leads onto a bright fruity palate with hints of pears and melon. An excellent aperitif on its own or with peach juice as a Bellini. Prosecco is the grape variety as well as the style of the wine.
22. **Baron de Beaupre Brut** £34.95
A good characterful Champagne with fine mousse, full fruity flavour and a toasty finish. Great value for money!
